The Oklahoma Office of Workforce Development (OOWD) CompTIA A+ Mentored Learning Program is a **free program** offering online instructor-led workshops that cover a technical computer curriculum geared toward the CompTIA A+ certification. Graduates are then connected to local area employers for jobs with assistance from the CompTIA Career Services team.

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be at least 18
- Have a high school diploma or GED equivalent
- Must be a displaced worker (e.g. temporarily or permanently laid off due to COVID-19, self-employed and lost a job or underemployed due to COVID-19, long-term unemployed)
- Applicants must own or have access to a laptop/desktop computer with webcam enabled; have access to the Internet with 10 Mbps download and 1 Mbps upload speeds; and may need a pair of comfortable headphones with microphone (recommended for voice chat)

CompTIA A+ is the industry standard for launching IT careers in today's digital world. IT pros who hold CompTIA A+ make, on average, \$51,375. Job roles include Service Desk Analyst, Help Desk tech and Technical Support Specialist.
